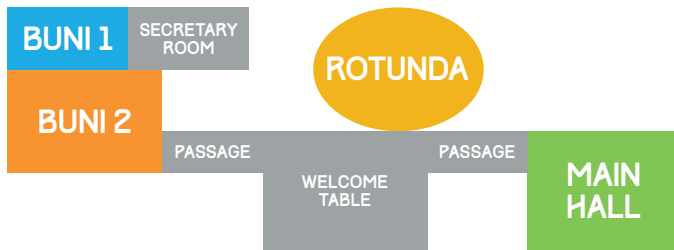




## ABOUT INNOVATION WEEK 2018 21-26 MAY 2018
