

Encouraging our top Skills

At MeTL Group, we have a "Caliber Inventory" method wherein all our employees across units are annually appraised. Every unit has its own appraisal cycle. The appraisal follows a scoring method where employees are assessed against certain

parameters. To reduce subjectivity, each employee is appraised by the reporting officer, the reporting officer's reporting officer, and, possibly, by a third appraiser from an allied department. Scores are then statistically moderated to eliminate the effect of too

strict and too lenient appraisals. Employees are then graded in 'A' to 'E' categories – 'A' being the top performers.

The Caliber Inventory method helps us identify the strength areas and weakness of the employees. It gives us an analytical study of all the employee so we can understand them better and can give them constructive feedback. It helps employees improve their performance levels. It also helps in rewarding employees more scientifically.
